



Artemizia Foundation Presents Layla Love: Rewilding & The Feminine Mystique

The Artemizia Foundation is proud to present Layla Love: Rewilding & The Feminine Mystique, a solo photography exhibition by acclaimed artist Layla Love, opening Saturday January 10, 2026, with an opening reception free and open to the public from 1 to 4 p.m. The show will be on view through March 1.

Through a striking and deeply symbolic photographic language, Rewilding & The Feminine Mystique explores the reclamation of feminine power, intuition, and embodied wisdom in dialogue with the natural world. Layla Love's work invites viewers into liminal spaces where body, landscape, ritual, and spirit converge, challenging cultural narratives that separate humanity from nature and femininity from strength.

With more than 100 international exhibitions, including Paris Photo, Art Basel, and AIPAD, Love has shown her work alongside masters such as Picasso, Warhol, and Basquiat. A defining milestone in her career was exhibiting with Eric Franck Fine

Arts in London beside Henri Cartier-Bresson, whose mastery of the decisive moment echoes in Love's own artistic vision.

Rooted in themes of transformation, ecological consciousness, and ancestral memory, Love's images evoke a process of "rewilding": a return to instinct, sovereignty, and interconnectedness. The feminine emerges not as an idealized construct, but as a living force... wild, cyclical, and unapologetically present.

"Layla Love's photography does not merely depict the feminine, it activates it," says AF Director Sloane Bouchever. "Her work speaks to a collective longing to remember who we are beneath systems of control, disconnection, and domestication."

Set within the historic landscape of Bisbee, Gallery 818 provides an intimate and contemplative setting for this body of work. Visitors are encouraged to experience the exhibition slowly, allowing the images to unfold as meditations on presence, resilience, and the sacred intelligence of the Earth.

BISBEE HIGH SCHOOL CHALK TALK

Hello, and Happy New Year from Mrs. Brett and our art students at Bisbee High School! The first half of this school year has been excellent, and it looks like 2026 will continue to be one of growth and discovery. Our students have done incredible work, from beginning to advanced classes in visual arts and ceramics.

Visual-arts classes started the year strong, illustrating dictionary pages with watercolor pencils. Several of these beautiful art pieces, as well as some of their other painting and sculpture work, were showcased at the Copper Queen Library's youth art show in the Pritchard Gallery from September through November. In a nutshell, our visual-arts students have so far created artwork in a broad range of styles, subject matter and media. They've explored drawing, painting and sculpture with colored pencils, charcoal, oil and chalk pastels, acrylic and watercolor paints, ceramic clay, and more. These young artists have practiced techniques such as paper marbling, book making, collage, linoleum printmaking, Zen tangles, and 3D design using Tinkercad and our 3D printer. Every visual-arts and ceramics student has set up their own digital portfolio and are able to photograph and upload their work.

Ceramics classes have also been busy learning new and old skills, including hand building techniques and the pottery wheel, as well as glazing and painting their work. These students have produced impressive pieces, including bird and fairy houses, shoes, tile triptychs, masks, their ideal meals, bowls, cups, symbolic autobiographical sculptures, piggy banks, cookie stamps, textured tree tiles, and more!

I can't describe all the wonderful things going on in our beautiful art room but just know that every student is learning and growing. We couldn't do it without the generous support of our Bisbee community, who have given their time, expertise and money to help build up the arts at Bisbee High School.
